Sakku's vision is to build a viable and healthy economy for Inuit in the Kivalliq. The Sakku Scholarship Fund builds upon this vision and mandate by assisting Inuit students pursue post-secondary education in the fields of Administration, Business, Financial and Management Studies.

The period for applications is July 1 to August 31, 2019 at 5:00 p.m. (CST).

Students who do not complete the academic year for which they receive the scholarship will be required to pay back the amount received in full from KIA.

## How do I apply?

Read the application guidelines, application form and eligibility rules carefully. Make sure to include all required documents. Application forms are available on our website, from your local CLO office or from the KIA head office in Rankin Inlet.

### Eligibility

- Enrolled under the Nunavut Agreement from the Kivalliq region;
- Enrolled in full-time post secondary studies at an accredited post secondary institution and maintain a full class load as defined by the program, entering second year or higher;
- Maintain a cumulative average of 70% or higher;
- Applicants applying directly upon High School graduation must provide Official Transcripts of High School grades;
- Mature applicants, i.e. individuals who have been out of school for 12 months or longer, must provide copies of the latest academic program grades PLUS 2 letters of reference from previous instructors or teachers (immediate family members cannot be used for reference letter purposes).

## Criteria

- Applicants must fill out the attached application form in full;
- A copy of your admission letter or confirmation of enrollment;
- Copies of your most recent academic transcripts, including your final cumulative average;
- A letter of intention detailing applicants goals, dreams and aspirations; and
- A copy of your NTI enrollment card.

### Selection Committee

The scholarship selection committee reviews all applications, with final approval from the KIA President. All decisions are final and there is no appeal process. When accessing applications the scholarship selection committee uses the following criteria:

- Demonstrated academic merit;
- Evidence of suitability and commitment to field of study;
- Quality and content of *letter of intent*; and
